

# CLIMBS AGAIN



It has been more than 40 years since the old King Kong first roared and raged his way across a movie screen. (You can find the plot of that old movie on the opposite page.) Now Hollywood has produced a new King Kong film.

The story of the new King Kong is different from the old. In the old film, Kong was captured by a movie company and brought to America. In the new film an oil company brings him back. Instead of using the Empire State Building, Kong climbs to the top of the World Trade Center in New York. In place of old-fashioned biplanes, modern jets attack Kong. And when he falls (see pages 8 and 9), he falls a bit further. The Trade Center towers are 110 stories tall, the Empire State Building is only 102.



Making a Monster Movie The producers of the new King Kong movie have built a 40-foot-tall mechanical Kong weighing 6½ tons. Complicated controls make 16 movements possible. Kong can do everything from rolling his eyes to picking up people with his giant fingers. But a lot of the new film uses models and camera tricks, just as the first Kong movie did. If you see the movie, try to tell the small models from the large mechanical monster. It will be hard because the "fakes" are very good.

Much of the first Kong movie was made with a model only 18 inches high. The little figure was carefully made to show powerful muscles. Rabbit fur covered the body. When Kong fought dinosaurs, or climbed the Empire State Building, the model was used. The tiny arms and legs would be moved a little bit and photographed. Then they would be moved a little more and photographed again. When all the separate photographs were projected at high speed, Kong appeared to move naturally.



**New York meets the new king.** The movie producers used locations in Hollywood, Hawaii, and New York City.

Thousands of New Yorkers became unpaid movie stars. Kong's actual fall from the roof of the World Trade Center was filmed in Hollywood. The fall was filmed with a model of Kong and a model of the Trade Center exactly one-seventh its real size. It took three nights and seventy-five thousand dollars to film the death scene. In the movie it will run about five minutes.


#### Francesca made him do it.


Read across, down, up and diagonally to find 20 hidden words. (Hint: You'd hear all these words at the filming of King Kong.)


